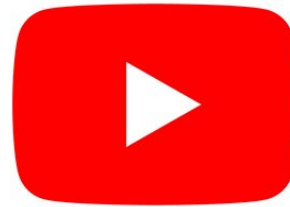
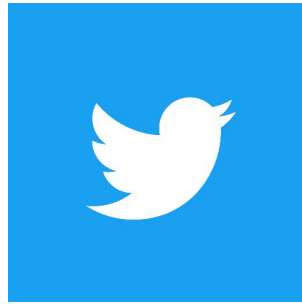

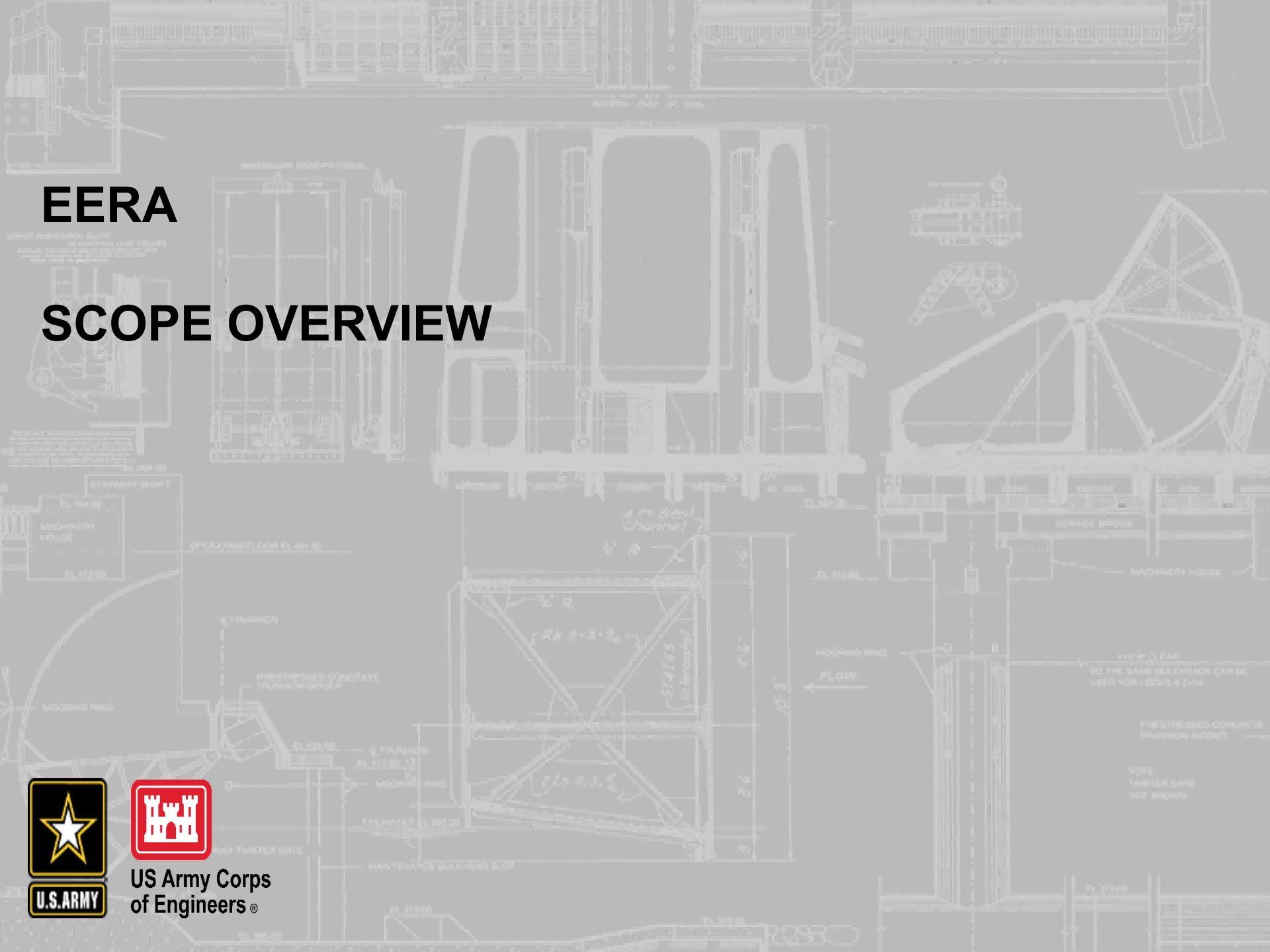

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EERA SCOPE OVERVIEW



The EERA MATOC allows CEHNC to continue the execution of missions assignments in accordance with:

Engineering Regulation 10-1-22 (Section 7 and Appendix A), Organization and Functions CEHNC, dated 27 November 2018. In accordance with ER 10-1-22 Paragraph 7 (“The Center is authorized to contract for assigned programs and for support to other USACE elements.”), Paragraph 7b (“Continuous mission assignments” for CEHNC), Appendix A, Paragraph 1 (e) (Environmental and Munitions continuing mission assignments) and Appendix D, Subparagraph (15) (CEHNC is one of four designated USACE MMDC’s and single designated center for CWM involving military munitions response actions)

USACE Engineering Regulation 1110-1-8153 dated 29 April 2016. In accordance with Paragraph 6a and 6b, the “work performed by USACE involving military munitions responses or actions to address unexploded ordnance (UXO), discarded military munitions (DMM), and munitions constituents (MC), including conventional munitions and/or chemical warfare materiel (CWM), for range clearance operations, readiness support, and support services during construction, dredging and environmental activities...and are performed safely, consistently, and efficiently across the executing programs.”

USACE Engineering Regulation 10-1-50 date 30 April 2012. In accordance with Paragraph 6, “The primary mission of the EM CX is to support the Corps headquarters, divisions, districts, laboratories, centers, and other customers in the performance of their military, civil, and work for others environmental missions. The EM CX performs this mission by maintaining state-of-the-art technical expertise and competencies for hazardous waste remediations, radioactive waste remediations, munitions response actions, chemical warfare materials responses, green and sustainable remediation and environmental compliance activities.”



EERA SCOPE OVERVIEW



The objective of the EERA MATOC is to provide continued support to munitions and emerging environmental concerns, to include CWM, Conventional Military Munitions, and Aqueous Film Forming Foam (AFFF) to assure public safety and environmentally protective responses.

The scope will require the contractors to have the capability to support multiple Task Orders (TOs) simultaneously at various geographical locations throughout the United States, including Alaska and Hawaii, the U.S. Territories, Outlying areas, as defined by FAR 2.101 and Territorial waters. The U.S. Army Engineering and Support Center (CEHNC) Ordnance and Explosives Directorate (OE) Program coordinates with the appropriate Area of Responsibility USACE District.

This table lists small business size standards matched to industries described in the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), as modified by the Office of Management and Budget, effective January 1, 2017. The latest NAICS codes are referred to as NAICS 2017.

The size standards are for the most part expressed in either millions of dollars (those preceded by “\$”) or number of employees (those without the “\$”). A size standard is the largest that a concern can be and still qualify as a small business for Federal Government programs. For the most part, size standards are the average annual receipts or the average employment of a firm. How to calculate average annual receipts and average employment of a firm can be found in 13 CFR § 121.104 and 13 CFR § 121.106, respectively.

SBA also includes the table of size standards in the Small Business Size Regulations, 13 CFR § 121.201. This table includes size standards that have changed since the last publication of 13 CFR § 121.
